REGISTRATION

(1) SKATERS

Skaters must register by completing the application form attached to this announcement and returning it to the address below by **February 1, 2010**. The acceptance of late entries is at the discretion of the Section in consultation with the Technical Representative.

(2) REGISTRATION FEES

Singles/Interpretive/Adult	\$65.00 per event

No refunds will be issued for any reason after the closing date of entries.

SKATERS REGISTERING FOR THE TRIATHLON CATEGORIES MAY NOT REGISTER FOR INDIVIDUAL FREE SKATE OR INTERPRETIVE CATEGORIES

(3) COACHES ACCREDITATION

Coaches must be a minimum of NCCP Level 1/ISPC Certified and must meet the following accreditation standards:

- be a current professional coaching member of Skate Canada
- hold a valid First Aid Certificate

Coaches must register in person and show their photo ID card.

MUSIC

All music used must be in the public domain or covered by the performing rights societies. Competitors, who have music composed especially for their program either wholly or in part, shall be responsible for obtaining a written release from the composer for the use of

such music on radio and television or appropriate clearance from the performing rights societies.

For the information of Dance competitors: 2001 Skate Canada Series 8 music will be used for all compulsory dance events.

Music Requirements

Each entry must provide two CDs for the competition upon registration. One for competition (marked "Master") and one for back up (marked "Copy").

Standard Specifications for CDs and Cassettes

1. Only one program shall be recorded on each CD.
2. The start of the music shall be recorded on the CD with less than two seconds of lead in.
3. Skater's name followed by music time (not skating time) shall be clearly printed on the CD.
4. Each CD shall be enclosed in its plastic container marked with the skater's name, event and total music time

AWARDS

Medals will be presented to the top three finalists of each discipline. In the case of only two entries, each entry shall be awarded a prize. In the case of only one entry in an event an exhibition skate shall be performed but no prize shall be awarded. The presentation schedule will be available at registration.

COSTUMING

The clothing for all competitors must be modest, dignified and appropriate for athletic competition – not garish or theatrical in design. Accessories and props are not permitted.

ACCIDENTS / LIABILITY

Skate Canada, the host Section and the Local Volunteer Team undertake no responsibility for damages or injuries suffered by skaters. As a condition of and in consideration of their entries in these Championships, all competitors and their parents or guardians shall be deemed to agree to assume all risks or injuries to the competitor's person and property resulting from, or caused by or connected with, the conduct and management of the competitions and to release any and all claims they may have against the officials, the Association, the Section, the Volunteer Team and against their officers and their entries shall be accepted only on these conditions.

EVENT SCHEDULE

A finalized schedule of events and practices if applicable will be provided to each club and posted on the Section website. Clubs must provide ONE current email address.

GENERAL REGULATIONS

ELIGIBILITY TO COMPETE (From Skate Canada Rule 5401)

- (1) Be eligible person(s) as defined in Skate Canada Rule Book Section 2100 (Rule 5401).
- (2) Be Associate member(s) in good standing of the Association (Rule 5401).
- (3) For eligibility in a sectional STARSkate competition, please note the following restrictions:

COMPETITIVE SKATERS: Skaters registered[Ⓢ] to compete in any event at the Novice or higher level at a Sectional or Sectional qualifying competition, do not qualify to compete in the Sectional STARSkate Championships in any category at any level. Skaters registered to compete in the Juvenile and Pre-Novice level at a Sectional or Sectional qualifying competition may register to compete in event categories at the STARSkate level other than those competed in at a Sectional or Sectional qualifying competition. Please see the table below for the qualifications for entry.

[Ⓢ] For the purposes of interpretation of this regulation, registration for a sectional or qualifying event is defined as the submission of a registration form for such event.

- (4) **WINNER OF A PREVIOUS QUALIFYING EVENT LEADING TO THE SECTIONAL STARSKATE CHAMPIONSHIPS:** A previous winner of a qualifying event for the Sectional STARSkate Championships is eligible to re-enter the same qualifying event provided that the competitor is still eligible to enter the corresponding category.
- (5) **TEST AND AGE PREREQUISITES:** Competitors wishing to enter the **2010 Alberta-NWT/Nunavut STARSkate Championships** and events leading to it shall meet the test requirements to compete before November 15

preceding the competition. Age requirements shall be met before October 1 preceding the competition.

- (6) **COMPETITIVE SINGLES TEST EQUIVALENCIES IN THE STARSkate PROGRAM:** As regulation 4000 –E – 3.1 states, skaters passing free skating tests in the competitive test system are granted equivalencies for regular free skating tests as follows:

Juvenile Competitive Singles Test = Senior Bronze Free Skating Test
Pre-Novice Competitive Singles Test = Junior Silver Free Skating Test
Novice Competitive Singles Test = Senior Silver Free Skating Test
Junior or Senior Competitive Singles Test = Gold Free Skating Test

Skaters who have passed any of the competitive test equivalencies must enter the STARSkate Championships at the level corresponding to their highest STARSkate test passed or at the level which they received the equivalency in the STARSkate Program, whichever is higher.

- (7) Skaters may participate in either the **2010 Alberta-NWT/Nunavut STARSkate Championships** or the 2010 Adult Championships, but not both.
- (8) In the case where the test requirements deadline for the event is November 15, skaters may skate up in the free skate categories if desired. Skating up is not permitted in the Triathlon, Biathlon, Skating Skills and Interpretive events.
- (9) Entrants in the Triathlon events must register to compete in the highest level that their test qualification qualifies them for. For example, a skater who has passed the Senior Silver Skating Skill, Bronze Interpretive and Senior Silver Free Skate must compete in Silver Triathlon and can not skate in Bronze Triathlon.
- (10) Should a Free Skate, Interpretive or Skating Skills event have only one entry, the skater will be given the option to skate at the next level or skate an exhibition. In the case of a dance category with only one entry, there will be no option to skate at the next level. An exhibition may be done.

EVENT SPECIFICATIONS

- (1) **EVENT COMPOSITION:** In normal circumstances, each category at the competition must be held for men and women separately. It is permissible for events that do not progress skaters on to a subsequent level of STARSkate Interclub competition to combine events as follows:
- (a) Combine two or more categories in the same event when each category has fewer than three entries;
 - (b) Combine two or more categories in the same event when one category has insufficient entries to hold the event;

The decision to combine events is at the discretion of the technical representative and the host committee.

In any of the above cases, categories may be combined – only with full prior knowledge and agreement of all competitors affected.

- (2) **GROUPING SKATERS:** The following guideline is suggested for grouping skaters:

Should entries in a category be exceedingly large, the event will be divided into groups by random draw. When grouping occurs, the following will be used to determine the number of skaters advancing to the final.

Number of Run-off Flights Skaters Advancing to Final Total Skaters in Finals:

2 Top 6 = 12

3 Top 4 = 12

4 Top 4 = 16

5 Top 3 = 15

For OBO events the top skaters in each group will proceed to the finals as indicated above. For CPC events where run-offs are necessary, the top 16 scores will proceed to the finals regardless of which runoff flights they were in.

- (3) **LIMITING OF ENTRIES:** Events may have to be limited if time does not allow all entries to skate. They will be limited on a first come first serve basis and will be limited in the following order: Pre-Preliminary 11 & Over events, Preliminary 11 & Over events, Pre-Preliminary 10 & Under events, Preliminary 10 & Under events, Junior Bronze events, and Senior Bronze events. If limited entries are enforced, the first 80 entries received will be registered and all remaining entries will be returned with a full refund.
- (4) **COMPOSITION OF PARTNERS:** Couples for Dance and Biathlon events may be comprised of two women (one performing the man's steps) one woman and one man or two men. Similar and mixed couples may compete against each other. Dance couples must represent one section.

PRACTICE ICE

Upon registration or attendance at an officially scheduled practice session (if held), skaters are not permitted to skate on any ice surface other than the official practice or competition ice as is scheduled for the event. Practice ice may be available if time permits. Clubs will be notified if practice ice is available, once entries close and ice needs are finalized.

RESULTS CALCULATION

(1) CPC

Please note that the CPC judging system will be used for Junior Bronze and higher free skating, all interpretive, as well as Biathlon and Triathlon events. All Junior Bronze & higher Free Skate events must submit a Planned Program content sheet at **the time of submitting their music at registration**. For all other events the “OBO” (one-by-one) results calculation method will be used.

***Note:** For interpretive events, ties are broken based on the individual component scores in priority according to the order listed.

Triathlon Events

A tie will be broken after each event part. For example, after the Interpretive program the tie is broken by the Interpretive Program, and after the Free Skate, the Free Skate program result breaks the tie.

EVENTS TO BE HELD

It is recommended that all STARSkate Championship events (Biathlon and Triathlon) be held at the Sectional STARSkate Championships. All other events are to be held at the discretion of the organizing committee.

All Free Skate Programs should meet the requirements for a Well Balanced Program as outlined in the Skate Canada STARSkate Competition Technical Package 2009-2010.

The test and age requirements for events are as follows:

FREE SKATE EVENTS

- (a) **PRE-PRELIMINARY FREE SKATE**
 - (i) **TEST:** Must not have passed the complete Preliminary Free Skate test
 - (ii) **SPECIFICATIONS FOR EVENT:** One free program of 1.5 minutes in length (+ / - 10 seconds)
- (b) **PRELIMINARY FREE SKATE**
 - (i) **TEST:** May have passed the Preliminary Free Skate test but no higher complete Free Skate test
 - (ii) **SPECIFICATIONS FOR EVENT:** One free program of 2.0 minutes in length (+/- 10 seconds)
- (c) **JUNIOR BRONZE FREE SKATE**
 - (i) **TEST:** May have passed the Jr. Bronze Free Skate test but no higher complete Free Skate test
 - (ii) **SPECIFICATIONS FOR EVENT:** One free program of 2.5 minutes in length (+/- 10 seconds)
- (d) **SENIOR BRONZE FREE SKATE**
 - (i) **TEST:** May have passed the Sr. Bronze Free Skate test but no higher complete Free Skate test
 - (iii) **SPECIFICATIONS FOR EVENT:** One free program of 3.0 minutes in length (+/- 10 seconds)

- (e) **JUNIOR SILVER FREE SKATE**
 - (i) **TEST:** May have passed the Jr. Silver Free Skate test but no higher complete Free Skate test
 - (ii) **SPECIFICATIONS FOR EVENT:** One free program of 3.5 minutes in length (+/- 10 seconds)
- (f) **SENIOR SILVER FREE SKATE**
 - (i) **TEST:** May have passed the Sr. Silver Free Skate test but no higher complete Free Skate test
 - (ii) **SPECIFICATIONS FOR EVENT:** One free program of 3.5 minutes in length (+/- 10 seconds)
- (g) **GOLD FREE SKATE**
 - (i) **TEST:** May have passed the Gold Free Skate test
 - (ii) **SPECIFICATIONS FOR EVENT:** One free program of 3.5 (women) or 4.0 (men) minutes in length (+/- 10 seconds)

INTERPRETIVE EVENTS

- (a) **PRE- INTRODUCTORY INTERPRETIVE**
 - (i) **TEST:** Must not have passed any Skate Canada Interpretive Skating test
 - (ii) **SPECIFICATIONS FOR EVENT:** One Interpretive program of 2.0 to 3.0 minutes in length (+/- 10 seconds)
- (b) **INTRODUCTORY INTERPRETIVE**
 - (i) **TEST:** Must have passed the Introductory Interpretive test but no higher Interpretive test
 - (ii) **SPECIFICATIONS FOR EVENT:** One Interpretive program of 2.0 to 3.0 minutes in length (+/- 10 seconds)
- (c) **BRONZE INTERPRETIVE**
 - (i) **TEST:** Must have passed the Bronze Interpretive test but no higher Interpretive test

- (ii) **SPECIFICATIONS FOR EVENT:** One Interpretive program of 2.0 to 3.0 minutes in length (+/- 10 seconds)
- (d) **SILVER INTERPRETIVE**
- (i) **TEST:** Must have passed the Silver Interpretive test but no higher Interpretive test
- (ii) **SPECIFICATIONS FOR EVENT:** One Interpretive program of 2.0 to 3.0 minutes in length (+/- 10 seconds)
- (e) **GOLD INTERPRETIVE**
- (i) **TEST:** Must have passed the Gold Interpretive test
- (ii) **SPECIFICATIONS FOR EVENT:** One Interpretive program of 2.0 to 3.0 minutes in length (+/- 10 seconds)

TRIATHLON

- (a) **BRONZE TRIATHLON**
- (i) **TEST:** Must have passed at least two of the following tests: Junior Silver Free Skate test, and/or Junior Silver Skating Skills test, and/or Bronze Interpretive Test
- (ii) **SPECIFICATIONS FOR EVENT:** The Bronze Triathlon shall consist of 3 parts:
- One Creative Skating Skills Exercise (technical requirements available in the STARSkate Technical Package)
 - One Interpretive program of 2.0 to 3.0 minutes in length (+/- 10 seconds)
 - One Free Skate program of 3.5 minutes in length (+/- 10 seconds)
- (b) **SILVER TRIATHLON**
- (i) **TEST:** Must have passed at least two of the following tests: Senior Silver Free Skate test, and/or Senior Silver Skating Skills test, and/or Silver Interpretive Test
- (ii) **SPECIFICATIONS FOR EVENT:** The Silver Triathlon shall consist of 3 parts:
- One Creative Skating Skills Exercise (technical requirements available in the STARSkate Technical Package)
 - One Interpretive program of 2.0 to 3.0 minutes in length (+/- 10 seconds)

- One Free Skate program of 3.5 minutes in length (+/- 10 seconds)

(c) GOLD TRIATHLON

- (i) TEST:** Must have passed at least two of the following tests: Gold Free Skate test, and/or Gold Skating Skills test, and/or Gold Interpretive test
- (ii) SPECIFICATIONS FOR EVENT:** The Gold Triathlon shall consist of 3 parts:
- One Skating Skills Creative Exercise (technical requirements available in the STARSkate Technical Package)
 - One Interpretive program of 2.0 to 3.0 minutes in length (+/- 10 seconds)
 - One Free Skate program of 3.5 minutes in length (+/- 10 seconds) for women or 4.0 minutes in length (+/- 10 seconds) for men

Note: All Triathlon events to be skated in the order listed and not all on same day.

(7) BIATHLON

(a) BRONZE DANCE BIATHLON

- (i) TEST:** At least one partner must have passed the complete Junior Silver Dance test (and no higher)
- (ii) SPECIFICATIONS FOR EVENT:** This competition shall consist of two parts:
- **COMPULSORY DANCES:** European and Rocker Foxtrot
 - **CREATIVE DANCE:** One selection of Skate Canada or ISU music or a free choice of music selected from the compulsory dance rhythms of the Senior Bronze Dance Test. No time requirement. The pattern shall consist of a full circuit of the ice or a half pattern repeated. Technical requirements available in the STARSkate Technical Package

(b) SILVER DANCE BIATHLON

- (i) TEST:** At least one partner must have passed the complete Senior Silver Dance test (and no higher)

- (ii) **SPECIFICATIONS FOR EVENT:** This competition shall consist of two parts:
- **COMPULSORY DANCES:** Harris Tango and Kilian
 - **CREATIVE DANCE:** A 2.0 minute (+/- 10 seconds) dance created to Skate Canada or ISU music or a free choice of music selected from the compulsory dance rhythms of the Senior Silver Dance Test. Technical requirements available in the STARSkate Technical Package
- (c) **GOLD DANCE BIATHLON**
- (i) **TEST:** At least one partner may have passed the complete Gold Dance test or higher.
- (ii) **SPECIFICATIONS FOR EVENT:** This competition shall consist of two parts:
- **COMPULSORY DANCES:** Paso Doble and Blues
 - **CREATIVE DANCE:** A 2.5 minute (+/- 10 seconds) dance created to Skate Canada or ISU music or a free choice of music selected from the compulsory dance rhythms of the Gold Dance and Diamond Dance tests. Technical requirements available in the STARSkate Technical Package

Note: All Biathlon events to be skated in the order listed and not all on same day.

ADULT EVENTS

ADULT EVENTS WILL FOLLOW THE REQUIREMENTS AS PER THE 2009-10 ADULT COMPETITION TECHNICAL PACKAGE

a) ADULT BRONZE FREE SKATE

- (j) **TEST:** Must not have passed the complete Jr. Bronze Free Skate test
- (iii) **SPECIFICATIONS FOR EVENT:** One free program with a maximum length of 2 minutes 40 seconds in length. Program may be shorter.

b) ADULT SILVER FREE SKATE

- (k) **TEST:** Must have passed the complete Jr. Bronze Free Skate test but not the complete Senior Bronze Free Skate test.

- (iv) **SPECIFICATIONS FOR EVENT:** One free program with a maximum length of 3 minutes 10 seconds in length. Program may be shorter.

c) ADULT GOLD FREE SKATE

- (l) **TEST:** Must have passed the complete Sr. Bronze Free Skate test but not the complete Jr. Silver Free Skate test.
- (v) **SPECIFICATIONS FOR EVENT:** One free program with a maximum length of 3 minutes 40 seconds in length. Program may be shorter.

d) ADULT MASTERS FREE SKATE

- (m) **TEST:** Must have passed the complete JR. Silver Free Skate test but no competitive Singles test. The Masters Frees kating event may be divided into more than one group if necessary depending on the level of entries received.
- (vi) **SPECIFICATIONS FOR EVENT:** One free program with a maximum length of 4 minutes 10 seconds in length. Program may be shorter.

e) ADULT COMPETITIVE FREE SKATE

- (n) **TEST:** Must have passed a complete competitive Singles test. The Adult Competitive category will not be divided by age class unless entry numbers warrant.
- (vii) **SPECIFICATIONS FOR EVENT:** One free program with a maximum length of 4 minutes 10 seconds in length. Program may be shorter.

ADULT INTERPRETIVE

PRE-INTRODUCTORY INTERPRETIVE

Must not have passed any Skate Canada Interpretive Skating test. One Interpretive program of 2.00 to 3.00 minutes (+/- seconds) in length. Entrants will not be penalized for a program time of less than 2.00 min.

INTRODUCTORY INTERPRETIVE

Must have passed the Introductory Interpretive test but no higher Interpretive test.

One Interpretive program of 2.00 to 3.00 minutes (+/- seconds) in length. Entrants will not be penalized for a program time of less than 2.00 min.

BRONZE INTERPRETIVE

Must have passed the Bronze Interpretive test but no higher Interpretive test.

One Interpretive program of 2.00 to 3.00 minutes (+/- seconds) in length. Entrants will not be penalized for a program time of less than 2.00 min.

SILVER INTERPRETIVE

Must have passed the Silver Interpretive test but no higher Interpretive test.

One Interpretive program of 2.00 to 3.00 minutes (+/- seconds) in length. Entrants will not be penalized for a program time of less than 2.00 min.

GOLD INTERPRETIVE

Must have passed the Gold Interpretive test.

One Interpretive program of 2.00 to 3.00 minutes (+/- seconds) in length. Entrants will not be penalized for a program time of less than 2.00 min.

OPEN ADULT COUPLES INTERPRETIVE

No test requirements.

One Interpretive program of 2.00 to 3.00 minutes (+/- seconds) in length. Entrants will not be penalized for a program time of less than 2.00 min.

OFFICIALS (from Rule 7504)

- (1) **SELECTION OF OFFICIALS:** Technical controllers, technical specialists, judges, referees and data specialists shall be selected from the official association judges and data specialists list. Judges and referees must be eligible persons. A panel of at least five judges is recommended for all events as stated in Section A of the CPC Rulebook.
- (2) **COMPOSITION OF THE PANELS:** For Interclub or Invitational events of the type listed in Rule 7302, Primary judges may be used for any event requiring no more than a Preliminary test as a prerequisite for entry. For all other events, Juvenile or higher judges must be used and must be qualified at the applicable level of the event (i.e., Juvenile or higher judges for Juvenile/Senior Bronze test or lower events; Pre-Novice judges or higher for Pre-Novice/Junior Silver - Gold test events, etc.).
- (3) **INTERCLUB JUDGES:** “Interclub Judges” are qualified to judge all gold and lower events at Interclub or Invitational competitions.
- (4) **COMBINED EVENTS:** For combined events (e.g. Triathlon and Biathlon), it is recommended that the same panel of officials be used for all parts of the event.
